

INTRODUCTION (ABOUTUS)

STARTED WITH A VISION

The late Monsignor Mateo Sheedy saw the children of his parish struggle to finish high school, so he envisioned a transformative middle school to provide access to teachers and an inspiring curriculum that prepares students to succeed in college-prep high schools. His dream school would provide the academic, spiritual, and emotional support needed to break the cycle of poverty through education. In early 2000, Fr. Mateo invited a Jesuit priest, Fr. Peter Pabst, S.J. to undertake the project, bringing with him the **Nativity** model of education.

NATIVITY MODEL INFLUENCED BY JESUIT TEACHING

As we celebrate our 21st year, Our Lady of Grace and Sacred Heart Nativity Schools remain the only non-profit, private Catholic middle schools in San Jose focused on academic intervention for students from underserved communities. The Nativity model includes longer school days, weekend programming, and an extended school year that includes summer school. We couple this structure with a Jesuit-informed program providing a holistic education that supports the growth and development of a child intellectually, spiritually, physically, and emotionally.

INSPIRING THE NEXT GENERATION

Most students live in the Washington/Guadalupe neighborhood on the outskirts of downtown San Jose. Nativity students come from economically challenged families that truly care about education. The students often enter our school testing below grade level, but by the time they graduate, they are prepared for the rigors of a college prep high school.

SUPPORTING STUDENTS BEYOND GRADUATION

Another part of the Nativity model is to support students after graduation to foster their continued development, achievement, and contribution to their communities. The Graduate Support team works with students and their families to insure they are prepared to take on the rigors of high school, and continues support throughout high school and beyond.

IGNATIAN EDUCATOR AWARD 2021-22

Congratulations to **Raul Tornel**, the recipient of the 2021-22 Ignatian Educator Award. This honor is given to the faculty member who best exemplifies the spirit of Magis, a Jesuit philosophy of doing more for Christ, and therefore doing more for others.

"I always say my education started when I entered college because no one talked to me about it until the end of my senior year in high school,



which was too late to apply to a four-year program," said Raul.

Raul had a desire to play soccer at a collegiate level, so he attended West Valley College, and transferred to Chico State, playing soccer at both schools. He received a BA in Liberal Studies with a minor in Spanish.

Before joining Nativity four years ago, Raul worked with atrisk kids who were affected by gang violence through the City

of San Jose. He then spent 15 years at Catholic Charities working on literacy and enrichment programs for elementary and middle schools, as well as sports leagues, and empowerment groups. Following Catholic Charities, he was the Dean of Students at ACE Charter School and was then "blessed to move to Nativity."

Raul says, "I love the work that I do at Nativity because I get to use everything that I have learned from my other jobs and from my own experience, to help students. I love working with the families, the students, and the Catholic community."

During the award ceremony, former principal Lorraine described some of the reasons that Raul was chosen for the award this year:

"Raul is the ultimate team player and is always willing to help, no matter what the task. In addition to managing the Graduate Support Team, he has coached basketball and organized March Madness activities for the students. He works hard to empower our alumni and their families, and is a true lifelong learner who seeks the Magis to understand and build his relationship with God. During the year, he participated in the leadership program through the University of Notre Dame with an emphasis on serving Latinx students."

While students enter our program testing one to two grade levels behind in English and Math, when they graduate from 8th grade, they are at or above grade level and prepared to attend a college prep high school. Key elements of our program include:

- Small class sizes with 13-15 students
- Laptop computers for all
- Extended school day from 7:45am 5:00pm (Doors are open from 7:00am – 6:00pm)
- Monthly Saturday enrichment programs
- **Co-curricular programs** include athletics, robotics, art, and Folklorico dancing
- An 11-month school year from September to July

MISSION STATEMENT

BREAKING THE CYCLE OF POVERTY THROUGH EDUCATION

Sacred Heart Nativity School for boys and Our Lady of Grace Nativity School for girls are urban Catholic middle schools. In partnership with the Society of Jesus, the Diocese of San Jose, and the Parish of Sacred Heart, the schools seek to lay the foundation for young women and men to succeed in college prep high school programs, in college, and beyond. The schools are dedicated to providing a Catholic education for students of low-income families with priority given to families of the Sacred Heart Parish community. In the Jesuit tradition, Nativity students are encouraged to deepen their relationship with God as they become women and men for others.
